An Act to Establish an Alternate Elderly Low Cost Drug Program.

2 Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §6165 is enacted to read: 4 §6165. Alternate program 6 1. Age; residence. An individual ineligible under section 6162-A is eligible for an alternate elderly low-cost drug program 8 if that individual is 65 years of age or older and is a legal resident of this State at the time the application is filed. 10 2. Benefit levels. Benefits under the alternate program 12 are calculated as follows, "Benefit base" has the same meaning as set out in section 6201, subsection 1. 14 A. If an individual's income is \$0 to \$10,000, the benefit 16 equals 100% of the benefit base up to a maximum of \$400. 18 B. If an individual's income is \$10,001 to \$15,000, the 20 benefit equals 75% of the benefit base up to a maximum of \$300. 22 C. If an individual's income is \$15,001 to \$20,000, the benefit equals 50% of the benefit base up to a maximum of 24 \$200. 26 D. If an individual's income is more than \$20,000, the benefit equals 25% of the benefit base up to a maximum of 28 \$100. 30 The income limitations in this subsection must be adjusted annually in the same manner as provided in chapter 907. 32 34 3. Drugs covered. Drugs available under the alternate program established in this section are limited to drugs used for the following conditions, illnesses or diseases: 36 38 A. Respiratory; 40 B. Cardio-vascular or hypertension; and 42 C. Diabetes. 4. Administration; appeals. Section 6162-A, subsection 7 44 and sections 6163 and 6164 apply to the alternate program. 46 STATEMENT OF FACT 48 This bill establishes an alternate elderly low-cost drug program for persons 65 years of age or older. Under this 50 alternate program only certain drugs are authorized.

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
