An Act Requiring the Department of Environmental Protection to Adopt Rules for a Waiver of Fee and a 2-Year Extension to Low-income People in Meeting Motor Vehicle Emission Standards.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §2403, sub-§3, $\P\P A$ and B, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 818, §2, are amended to read:

A. A low emission adjustment is performed on the vehicle; and

B. Either the estimated cost of repairs and adjustment necessary to bring the vehicle into compliance with emission standards or the actual cost of repairs already performed on the vehicle in accordance with the inspection report under section 2404, subsection 3 exceeds the repair cost limit as specified in subsection $4_{\tau;}$ and

Sec. 2. 38 MRSA §2403, sub-§3, ¶C is enacted to read:

 18 C. The vehicle's owner is a recipient of at least one of the following programs of public assistance: Medicaid, Maine
20 Health Program, family crisis assistance, Low-income Home Energy Assistance Program or food stamps and the motor
22 vehicle has not been granted a waiver upon previous inspection.

Sec. 3. 38 MRSA \$2407, sub-\$4, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 818, \$2, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

4. Inspection fee waived. The inspection fee must be waived for motor vehicles owned by a recipient of at least one of the following programs of public assistance: Medicaid, Maine Health Program, family crisis assistance, Low-income Home Energy Assistance Program or food stamps.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill amends the provision adopted in 1991 for the Board of Environmental Protection to establish by rule a waiver of the 38 fee for a waiver of automobile emission standards for those 40 persons for whom, in its judgment, the fee poses an economic burden and a waiver of repairs over a repair cost limit 42 established by rule consistent with the requirements of the Federal Clear Air Act Amendments of 1990, PL 101-549 and federal This bill removes the waiver determinations from regulation. 44 rule-making and provides in law for waivers of the fee for recipients of certain state assistance programs and for a 46 one-time 2-year waiver of repairs for recipients of the same programs. 48
