Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 15 MRSA §3203-A, sub-§7, ¶B-3 is enacted to read:

6 B-3. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a juvenile
8 may be detained in the Penobscot County Jail, as long as the
10 juvenile is detained in a separate juvenile section approved
12 by the federal Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency
14 Prevention and in compliance with paragraph A.

STATEMENT OF FACT

14 This bill allows for the detention of juveniles in a separate juvenile section of the Penobscot County Jail.
