2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1812-G, sub-§2, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1991, c.
421, §1, is amended to read:

6 A. Any convictions of abuse, neglect or misappropriation of
8 property of a ~~resident, client or patient~~ an individual; and

10 STATEMENT OF FACT

12 The Maine Registry of Certified Nursing Assistants was
14 established by Public Law 1991, chapter 421 to comply with the
16 requirements of the federal Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of
1987.

18 To ensure that certified nursing assistants with a previous
20 history of abuse, neglect or misappropriation of the property of
any individual are properly identified on the Maine Registry of
22 Certified Nursing Assistants, a statutory change is required.
Current law limits convictions to those nursing assistants who
24 have abused, neglected or misappropriated the property of persons
in a health care setting.
