COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "1" to H.P. 1034, L.D. 1386, Bill, "An Act to Clarify the Financial Authority of the Workers' Compensation Board"

Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 1 and 2 and inserting in their place the following:

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'Sec. 1. 2 MRSA §6-E is enacted to read:

<u>§6-E. Salaries of certain employees of the Workers' Compensation</u> <u>Board</u>

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the salaries of the following employees of the Workers' Compensation Board are established by the Workers' Compensation Board and must be within the salary ranges indicated in this section.

30 **<u>1. Executive director.</u>** The salary of the executive director is within salary range 91.

2. General counsel. The salary of the general counsel is 34 within salary range 86.

36 **<u>3. Deputy general counsel.</u>** The salary of the deputy general counsel is within salary range 85.

<u>4. Assistants to the general counsel.</u> The salary of the assistants to the general counsel is within salary range 82.

5. Deputy directors. The salary of the deputy directors is within the following salary ranges:

A. Deputy director of medical and rehabilitation, salary 46 range 82;

STATEMENT OF FACT 30 32 This amendment replaces the section of the bill related to the salaries of certain employees of the Workers' Compensation Board with a provision giving the board the authority to set the 34 salaries within the specified salary ranges. The amendment 36 removes a position that does not exist within the Workers' Compensation Board from the list of major policy-influencing positions. The amendment removes the 2 sections of the original 38 bill that required penalties to be deposited in the Workers' 40 Compensation Board Administrative Fund, rather than the General Fund. The amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill. 42
