

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2003, sub-§8, as amended by PL 1991, c. 865,
§3, is further amended to read:

6 8. Term of permit. All Except as otherwise provided in
8 this subsection, all concealed firearm permits are valid for 4
10 years from the date of issue, unless sooner revoked for cause by
12 the issuing authority. If a permit renewal is issued before the
14 expiration date of the permit being renewed, the permit renewal
is valid for 4 years from the expiration date of the permit being
renewed. If an application is made for a renewal permit during
the period for which the concealed firearm permit is valid, that
permit continues to be valid until the applicant is given notice
of nonrenewal or a renewal permit is issued.

20 STATEMENT OF FACT

22 This bill provides that a concealed firearm permit continues
24 to be valid until the applicant receives notice of nonrenewal or
is issued a renewal permit if the applicant has applied for the
renewal permit during the period the permit is valid.
