C. Spouses and children of veterans who are attending state-supported pest-secondary postsecondary vocational schools or institutions of collegiate grade shall must be admitted free of tuition. If a spouse or child of a veteran wants to pursue a course of study that is not available at a state-supported school or institution in this State, the division shall pay that spouse's or child's tuition at a state-supported postsecondary school or institution in a state that offers that course of study.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill enables a spouse or a child of an eligible veteran who wants to pursue a course of study that is not available at a state-supported school or institution in this State to attend a state-supported postsecondary school or institution in a state that offers that course of study, with tuition paid by the Division of Veterans' Services.
