Resolve, Directing That the State's Coastal Zone Management Program Be Amended to Include Monitoring of Shellfish Harvesting Areas by the Department of Marine Resources.

Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, integral components of national coastal zone management policy set forth in the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, 16 United States Code, Section 1451 et seq., are the protection of reasonable coastal-dependent economic growth, the encouragement of cooperation among public, state and local collection, analysis, governments and the synthesis and dissemination of coastal management information; and

Whereas, the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 permits grants to coastal states for the purpose of restoring and enhancing shellfish production; and

Whereas, the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 provides 18 for the protection of coastal waters, water quality, coastal habitat and public health and safety; and

Whereas, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, chapter 19 22 finds that the Maine coast is an asset of immeasurable value to the people of the State and the nation; and

Whereas, the coastal zone management policies of the State, 26 as set forth in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, chapter 19, include management of marine resources to enhance the economic 28 value of the State's renewable marine resources and the restoration and maintenance of fresh, marine and estuarine water 30 to allow for the broadest possible diversity of public and private uses; and

Whereas, the State anticipates receiving \$1,900,000 in 34 coastal zone management grants in fiscal year 1993-94; and

36 Whereas, the State's coastal zone management program does not provide for the use of any coastal zone management funds for 38 shellfish monitoring by the Department of Marine Resources after July 1, 1993; and

Whereas, effective shellfish monitoring is essential to 42 avoid the loss of hundreds of jobs and protect public health risks from the consumption of contaminated shellfish; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

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Sec. 1. Joint amendment. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Marine Resources and the Director of the State Planning Office within the Executive Department shall jointly prepare an amendment to the state coastal zone management program; and be it further

Sec. 2. Shellfish monitoring. Resolved: That the amendment must include shellfish monitoring by the Department of Marine Resources as a component of the state program; and be it further

12 Sec. 3. Area biologists. Resolved: That the amendment direct an additional \$250,000 of coastal zone management funds in each 14 fiscal year to the Department of Marine Resources to support 2 Marine Research Scientist I positions and 3 Marine Research 16 Scientist II positions to perform the functions of area biologists; and be it further

Sec. 4. Submission to the Secretary of Commerce. Resolved: That the Director of the State Planning Office shall submit that amendment to the United States Secretary of Commerce no later than May 21, 1993; and be it further

Sec. 5. Allocations. Resolved: That the following allocations are made from coastal zone management funds.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve directs the Commissioner of Marine Resources and the Director of State Planning to jointly prepare an 8 amendment to the State's coastal zone management program that 10 includes shellfish monitoring as a component of the state The amendment must specify that \$250,000 of coastal program. 12 zone management funds is to be used by the Department of Marine Resources to support 5 area biologists for the testing and 14 monitoring of shellfish harvesting areas. This resolve requires that the jointly prepared amendment be submitted to the United 16 States Secretary of Commerce no later than May 21, 1993.

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An allocation section is included in the resolve.
