	adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

	the House of Representatives; and one member appointed by the
24	majority of those 4 commissioners who shall serve as chair of the
	commission. The 5 members must be residents of the State,

44	preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
46	STATEMENT OF FACT
48	This resolve creates a Commission to Study the Size of the
50	Legislature. The commission shall submit its report and any implementing legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 116th Legislature.
