RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Freeze the Property Taxes of Citizens Aged 65 and Older under Certain Circumstances.

Presented by Representative MITCHELL of Freeport. Cosponsored by Senator: VOSE of Washington. **Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED:** Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

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Constitution, Art. IX, §8, sub-§5 is enacted to read:

5. Tax relief for older citizens. Beginning with the property tax year 1994, any person having legal or beneficial title to real property in this State and who is liable for property taxes is entitled to property tax relief if the property for which relief is sought consists of the principal dwelling and no more than 10 contiguous acres and if the person in any year that relief is sought:

A. Is a permanent resident of this State;

- <u>B. Is 65 years of age or older and any adults domiciled</u> with the person are 65 years of age or older;
- 20 <u>C. Occupies as a home the real property for which the</u> person seeks relief; and
 - D. Is exempt from federal income tax liability and payment of taxes on social security income.

A person meeting the qualifications set out in this subsection may file a claim for property tax relief with the tax assessor of the municipality in which the property is located and, upon approval, shall pay the tax levied on said property for the first year a claim for relief is filed and may continue to pay in each subsequent year the same amount of tax or such lesser amount as may be levied against the real property.

36 Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding 40 a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of 42 this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question: 44

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"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine as proposed by a resolution of the Legislature to freeze under certain circumstances the property taxes of Maine citizens aged 65 and older?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This constitutional resolution allows the property taxes on certain homesteads to be effectively frozen at the prevailing rate provided that the property owner is a Maine resident who is 65 years of age or older, occupies the homestead property and meets certain income criteria.

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
