Amend the amendment in section 12 in that part designated  
"~~§220-B.~~" in subsection 5 in the 2nd line (page 6, line 37 in  
amendment) by striking out the following: "3" and inserting in  
its place the following: '6'

STATEMENT OF FACT

The committee amendment offers to applicants 4 combinations  
of education and experience totaling 6 years in order to qualify  
as a certified interior designer. Two of these combinations, 3  
years of education and 3 years of experience and 2 years of  
education and 4 years of experience, are to expire after 3  
years. This amendment has these combinations expire after 6  
years.
