**1. Board.** "Board" means the State Board of Registration for Interior Designers.

 4 2. Interior designer. "Interior designer" means an individual who provides or offers to provide interior design
 6 services.

- 3. Interior design services. "Interior design services" means services including, but not limited to, the preparation of working drawings, plans and specifications relative to nonload-bearing interior construction, furnishings, space
   planning, fixtures and equipment.
- 14 <u>4. Registered interior designer.</u> "Registered interior designer" means an interior designer who has been duly 16 registered with the board in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

#### <u>§14322. Exemptions</u>

Use of title. This chapter does not prohibit a person
 from providing interior design services or from using the title
 "interior designer." A person may not use the title "registered
 interior designer" unless registered under this chapter.

26 <u>2. Architects. This chapter does not apply to licensed</u> architects registered under applicable state laws unless the 28 architects refer to themselves as "registered interior designers," in which case such architects must be registered 30 under this chapter.

#### SUBCHAPTER II

#### **REGISTRATION OF INTERIOR DESIGNERS**

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#### <u>§14323. Qualifications for registration of interior designers</u>

 1. Passage of examination. Each applicant for registration shall apply to the board. Except as otherwise provided in this
 chapter, each applicant must provide proof of passage of the examination administered by the National Council for Interior
 Design Qualifications or its successor organization, or an equivalent examination as specified by the board.

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2. Qualifications. In addition to proof of passage of the examination, the applicant must provide substantial evidence to the board that the applicant: 48

A. Is a graduate of a 5-year interior design program from50an accredited institution and has completed at least one<br/>year of diversified and appropriate interior design52experience;

<u>§14325. Application; fees</u>	
Application for registration as a registered interior designer must be on a form prescribed and furnished by the board

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For the purpose of defraying all expenses of the board, and as required for carrying out this chapter, the following fees and penalties must be paid.

**1. Application fee for registration.** For an application for registration, the board shall fix an amount that is reasonable and necessary for its purpose.

2. Registration fee. For the certification of registration 10 for a resident or nonresident, the board shall fix an amount that may not exceed \$250.

3. Renewal. For the biennial renewal of a certificate of registration, the board shall fix an amount that may not exceed \$150.

4. Reissuance. For the reissuance of a lapsed or suspended 18 certificate of registration, the board shall fix an amount that may not exceed \$150.

All appropriate fees must accompany applications and no part of these fees may be refunded except such parts as may be provided under the rules of the board when no certificate is issued. The board shall adopt a fee schedule and refund policy by rules adopted in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act.

#### 28 **§14326.** Certificates

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30 The board shall issue a certificate of registration upon payment of a registration fee, as provided for in this chapter, 32 to any applicant who, in the opinion of the board, has satisfactorily met all the requirements of this chapter. The 34 certificate must register the individual as a "registered interior designer." Certificates of registration must show the 36 full name of the registrant, have a registration number and be signed by the chair and the secretary of the board.

The issuance of a certificate of registration by the board is evidence that the person named therein is entitled to all the rights and privileges of a registered interior designer while the certificate remains unrevoked or unexpired.

44 §14327. Revocation and reissuance

46 The board may suspend or revoke the registration of a registered interior designer pursuant to Title 5, section 10004.
48 The board may refuse to issue or renew, or the Administrative Court, pursuant to Title 4, chapter 25, may revoke, suspend or refuse to renew the registration of a registered interior designer who is found guilty of:

 Fraud or deceit. The practice of any fraud or deceit in obtaining a certificate of registration as a registered interior designer;

**2. Negligence or misconduct.** Any gross negligence, incompetency or misconduct in the practice of interior design as a registered interior designer; or

3. Violations. Violating any provision of this chapter or 10 any rule of the board.

12 <u>A person may register a complaint of fraud, deceit, gross</u> negligence, incompetency or misconduct against a registered 14 <u>interior designer. These complaints must be in writing, sworn to</u> by the person making them and filed with the secretary of the 16 <u>board.</u>

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The board, for reasons it determines sufficient, may reissue a certificate of registration as an interior designer to a person whose certificate has been revoked, provided that 4 or more members of the board vote in favor of that reissuance. A new certificate of registration as an interior designer, to replace any certificate revoked, lost, destroyed or mutilated, may be issued, subject to the rules of the board, and a charge, as determined by the board, may be made for that issuance.

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#### <u>§14328. Expiration and renewal</u>

Certificates of registration expire on the last day of December of odd-numbered years following their issuance or 30 renewal and become invalid on that date unless renewed. It is 32 the duty of the secretary of the board to notify every person registered under this chapter of the date of the expiration of that person's certificate and the amount of the fee that is 34 required for its renewal for a 2-year period, except when the applicant has become registered during the 2nd year of the 2-year 36 period, then the registration fee is for the remaining one year of that 2-year period. The notice must be mailed at least one 38 month in advance of the date of the expiration of the certificate. Renewal may be effected at any time after receipt 40 of notice by the payment of a renewal fee established by the board. Registration may be renewed up to 90 days after the date 42 of expiration upon payment of a late fee of \$10 in addition to the renewal fee. Any person who submits an application for 44 renewal more than 90 days after the registration renewal date is 46 subject to all requirements governing new applicants under this chapter, except that the board may, in its discretion, giving due consideration to the protection of the public, waive examination 48 if the renewal application is made within 3 years from the date of the expiration. 50

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	The State Board of Registration for Interior Designers, as
48	established by Title 5, Section 12004-A, subsection 20-A, shall

1. Membership. The board consists of 5 members appointed by the Governor, 4 members of whom must have been interior 2 designers for a period of 5 years or more and would gualify upon 4 application to the board under this chapter to be registered interior designers. One member must be a representative of the public. The membership of the board must reasonably reflect 6 representation from the various geographic areas of the State. 8 2. Terms. Terms for all members are 3 years. Of the 10 initial appointments, 2 members must be appointed to serve for one year, 2 must be appointed to serve for 2 years, and the remaining member must be appointed to serve for 3 years. Members 12 serve until their successors are appointed and qualified. Initial terms begin upon the date of appointment by the 14 Governor. Partial terms over 2 years in length are considered full terms. A member may be reappointed for a successive term, 16 but a member may not serve more than two successive full terms. 18 **§14332.** Oualifications 20 A member of the board must be a citizen of the United States and a resident of this State. After the initial appointments, 22 the interior designer members must be registered interior 24 designers. §14333. Compensation 26 28 Members of the board are entitled to compensation according to the provisions of Title 5, chapter 379. 30 §14334. Removal; vacancies 32 The Governor may remove any member of the board for cause. Vacancies in the membership of the board must be filled for the 34 unexpired term by appointment by the Governor in accordance with 36 section 14332. 38 <u>§14335. Organization and meetings</u> 40 The board shall meet at least once a year to conduct its business and to elect its officers. Additional meetings must be held as necessary to conduct the business of the board, and may 42 be convened at the call of the chairman or a majority of the 44 board members. The board shall elect or appoint annually a chair, a 46 vice-chair and a secretary. A quorum of the board consists of 48 not less than 3 members and decisions must be made by a majority of those members present at the meeting. The board may adopt and 50 have an official seal.

#### §14336. Powers and duties

The board has the following powers and duties, in addition to those otherwise set forth in this chapter.

1. Registration, enforcement. The board shall evaluate the qualifications and supervise the examination of applicants for registration under this chapter, and shall investigate or cause to be investigated all complaints made to it and all cases of noncompliance with this chapter.

**2. Rules.** The board may, in accordance with procedures established by the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, adopt such rules as may be reasonably necessary for the proper performance of its duties and the administration of this chapter.

3. Hearings. Hearings may be conducted by the board to assist with investigations to determine whether grounds exist for suspension, revocation or denial of registration, or as otherwise determined necessary to the fulfillment of its responsibilities under this chapter.

The board may not refuse to renew a certificate of registration for any reason other than failure to pay a required fee, unless 24 it has afforded the applicant an opportunity for an adjudicatory hearing. The board shall hold an adjudicatory hearing at the 26 written request of a person who is denied a certificate of 28 registration without a hearing for any reason other than failure to pay a required fee, if the request for hearing is received by the board within 30 days of the applicant's receipt of written 30 notice of the denial of the application, the reasons for denial 32 and the applicant's right to request a hearing. Hearings must be conducted in conformity with Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter IV, 34 to the extent applicable. The board may subpoena witnesses, records and documents in any hearing it conducts.

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4. Contracts. The board may enter into contracts to carry 38 out its responsibilities under this chapter.

#### 40 §14337. Receipts and disbursements

42 The secretary of the board shall receive and account for all money derived under this chapter and shall pay the same, as 44 provided by law, to the Treasurer of State, who shall keep such money in a separate fund to be know as the "Registered Interior 46 Designers' Fund." The board may make expenditures from this fund, upon itemized vouchers approved by the chair of the board, 48 that in the opinion of the board are reasonably necessary for the proper performance of its duties under this chapter and for 50 promoting interior design education and standards in the State.

§14338. Records and reports; role of commissioner 2 1. Records. The board shall keep such records and minutes as are necessary to the ordinary dispatch of its functions. 4 6 2. Report. Not later than August 1st of each year, the board shall submit to the Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation a report of its transactions of the 8 preceding fiscal year ending June 30th and shall transmit to the 10 commissioner a complete statement of the receipts and expenditures of the board, attested by affidavits of its chair 12 and secretary. 14 Commissioner as liaison. The Commissioner of 3. Professional and Financial Regulation shall act as liaison 16 between the board and the Governor. Authority of commissioner. The Commissioner of 18 4. Professional and Financial Regulation may not exercise or 20 interfere with the exercise of discretionary, regulatory or licensing authority granted to the board under this chapter. The 22 commissioner may require the board to be accessible to the public for complaints and questions during regular business hours, to 24 maintain copies of all application materials with the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation and to provide any 26 information the commissioner requires in order to ensure that the board is operating administratively within the requirements of 28 this chapter. 30 5. Budget. The board shall submit to the Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation its budgetary reguirements in the same manner as is provided in Title 5, section 1665. 32 34 §14339. Roster of registered interior designers 36 A roster showing the names and places of business of all registered interior designers must be prepared by the secretary of the board during the first calendar quarter of each 38 even-numbered year. Copies of the roster must be mailed to each 40 registered interior designer listed on the roster and furnished to the public upon request for such fees as the board may 42 authorize in its rules. 44 STATEMENT OF FACT 46 This bill provides for the registration of interior designers. Interior designers provide design services which are 48 nonstructural in nature. These services include the preparation 50 of working drawings, plans and specifications relative to nonload-bearing interior construction, furnishings, space 52 planning, fixtures and equipment. Current law presently restricts interior designers from performing certain aspects of their profession. This bill is an effort to expand the areas in which interior designers may offer their services.

This bill also provides for the creation of a State Board of Registration for Interior Designers to administer and enforce the registration of interior designers.
