2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

	Whereas, the Somerset Gazette, a weekly newspaper published
6	in Skowhegan in the County of Somerset since April 16, 1990, has been publishing probate notices, notices of foreclosure, other
8	legal notices, legal advertising and other matter required by law
	to be published in a newspaper; and

	Whereas, this newspaper is entered as 3rd class postal
12	matter in the United States mails at the post office in
	Skowhegan, Maine; and

	Whereas, pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1,
16	section 601, for a newspaper to be qualified as a medium for the
1000	publication of legal notices, legal advertising and other matter
18	required by law to be published in a newspaper, that newspaper
	must be entered as 2nd class postal matter in the United States
20	mail; and

	notice when that notice has been published in the Somerset

	§602. Additional media for publication of notices

	Notwithstanding section 601, all probate notices, notices of
44	foreclosure, other legal notices, legal advertising and other
	matter required by law to be published in a newspaper that have
46	been published in the Coastal Journal from the date of its first
	publication on November 3, 1966 and in the Somerset Gazette from
48	the date of its first publication on April 16, 1990 to the
	effective date of this Act, and that would have been valid but
- ^	for the manifeliar of modium col that were to

	carrying such notices to be entered as 2nd class postal matter,
2	are declared to be valid.
4	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.
6	
8	STATEMENT OF FACT
10	This bill authorizes the publication of notices in the
	Somerset Gazette, which is not entered as 2nd class postal matter
12	in the United States mail. The bill incorporates a similar

exemption for the Coastal Journal that was created pursuant to Public Law 1967, chapter 428. Since these publications deal with

legal notices, reference in the Maine Revised Statutes should include both newspapers.

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
