SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 481, L.D. 1479, Bill, "An Act to Identify Laboratories Subject to the Laboratory Certification Program"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of the 2nd paragraph after the title (page 1, lines 27 to 31 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

'Whereas, this legislation exempts from the certification requirement wastewater laboratories that perform only certain routine tests; and'

Further amend the amendment by striking out in the 4th paragraph after the title the last sentence (page 2, line 1 through 9 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following: 'A laboratory operated by a waste discharge facility licensed pursuant to Title 38, section 413 may analyze waste discharges for total suspended solids, settleable solids, biological or biochemical oxygen demand, chemical oxygen demand, pH, chlorine residual, fecal coliform, E. coli, conductivity, color, temperature and dissolved oxygen without being certified under this section.'

Further amend the amendment by adding at the end before the statement of fact the following:

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment amends Committee Amendment "A" to remove the requirement that laboratories performing certain tests without certification be subject to laboratory qualifications contained in the waste discharge license issued by the Department of Environmental Protection. This amendment also provides that such laboratories may analyze waste discharges for biochemical oxygen demand and chemical oxygen demand.
