Sec. 4. Introduction of legislation authorized. The Joint Standing Committee on Utilities shall review all rules promulgated by the Federal Communications Commission pursuant to the federal Cable Television Consumer Protection and Competition Act of 1992, Public Law 102-385. The committee shall report out legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 116th Legislature containing the statutory provisions determined necessary by the committee to implement the regulatory authority granted to the State by that act, and by the rules promulgated pursuant to it, including if necessary, provisions petitioning the Federal Communications Commission for authority to regulate cable television systems in the State.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides consumers with increased information concerning cable franchise owners and prohibits a cable television system operator from diminishing a subscriber's privacy by providing private information about the consumer to others.

The bill also instructs the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities to monitor federal regulations promulgated pursuant to the federal Cable Television Consumer Protection and Competition Act of 1992, and authorizes the committee to report legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 116th Legislature to take necessary state implementation actions.
