COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "1" to H.P. 1099, L.D. 1486, Bill, "An Act to Consolidate All Substance Abuse Programs within the Office of Substance Abuse"

Amend the bill by striking out all of section 2 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §12004-G, sub-§13-C is enacted to read:

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Further amend the bill in section 12 in that part designated "<u>\$20065</u>" in subsection 1 in the 3rd line (page 3, line 28 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "<u>15</u>" and inserting in its place the following: '<u>17</u>'

Further amend the bill in section 12 in that part designated "<u>§20065</u>" by striking out all of subsection 3 and inserting in its place the following:

'<u>3. Members; representation. The commission consists of</u> the following members:

A. One member of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate and one member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. One of the members appointed under this paragraph must be from the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resources matters and one must be from the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters;

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2 [·]	B. One physician experienced in the treatment of substance abuse, appointed by the Governor;
4	C. One public school superintendent who has experience with school-based substance abuse prevention and education

18 Further amend the bill in section 15 in the last line (page 7, line 37 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "on a contract 20 basis" and inserting in its place the following: 'through interdepartmental agreements or other mechanisms'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 17 and 24 inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 17. Transition. Employees of the Division of Alcohol and Drug Educational Services within the Department of Education whose positions are transferred to the Office of Substance Abuse under this Act retain their positions within the Office of Substance Abuse, along with all of their employee rights, privileges and benefits. The Bureau of Human Resources within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services shall assist with the orderly implementation of this section.

Sec. 18. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

This bill results in General Fund savings of \$540,536 in fiscal year 1993-94 and \$542,203 in fiscal year 1994-95. 30

It transfers General Fund appropriations from various state 32 departments to the Executive Department, Office of Substance Abuse including \$30,188 in fiscal year 1993-94 and \$40,250 in 34 year 1994-95 from the Department of Corrections, fiscal \$1,132,321 in fiscal year 1993-94 and \$1,511,038 from the 36 Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation and \$583,882 38 in fiscal year 1993-94 and \$808,382 in fiscal year 1994-95 from the Department of Education.

This bill also deappropriates \$41,645 in fiscal year 1993-94 and \$54,249 in fiscal year 1994-95 from the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation due to the elimination of a Comprehensive Health Planner II position; and \$498,891 in fiscal year 1993-94 and \$487,954 in fiscal year 1994-95 from the Office of Substance Abuse due to savings from the consolidation of substance abuse services.

The Office of Substance Abuse will incur some minor additional costs to participate as а member of the

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Interdepartmental Council, to manage the transferred resources, to prepare a consolidation plan including the review of federal funding for substance abuse services and to report the findings. These costs can be absorbed within the office's existing budgeted resources.

The Department of Education, the Department of Corrections and the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation will experience minor savings as a result of the transfer of certain programs.

The Governor's proposed current services budget includes changes which may affect this bill's impact on the level of funding available for transfer. This estimate of the fiscal 14 impact may need to be adjusted based on final legislative actions on the current services budget.

This amendment changes the original bill as follows.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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It adds the Director of the Office of Substance Abuse to 1. the membership of the Interdepartmental Council and eliminates the members of the current Interdepartmental Council from the membership of the Substance Abuse Services Commission. Α physician, superintendent, elementary educator, attorney, higher education representative, private sector employer and substance abuse practitioners in the areas of education, prevention and treatment are added to the membership of the commission, increasing the total number of members from 15 to 17. The per diem authorized in the bill is changed to allow expenses only for members of the commission.

The amendment clarifies that the commission provides 2. oversight to the Office of Substance Abuse but does not direct its activities.

з. The amendment eliminates the Comprehensive Health 40 Planner II position in the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation and deappropriates All Other funds in the Office of 42 Substance Abuse in amount that reflects an the total deappropriation for the Office of Substance Abuse recommended in the Governor's budget for fiscal year 1994-95. The appropriation 44 section is amended to reflect that the transfer would occur around October 1st. The Office of Substance Abuse is directed to recommend reallocation of the All Other cut if it finds as abùse administrative savings substance services are consolidated in the office.

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4. Language is added to the bill to clarify that the Office 2 · of Substance Abuse continues current education efforts when the Department of Education program is transfered to the office. Also, transitional language is added to clarify that the current incumbents retain their positions, along with their accrued rights, benefits and privileges.
