Resolve, to Establish the Labor and Welfare Transition Team to Facilitate the Inclusion within the Department of Labor of Certain Welfare Functions of the Department of Human Services.

Presented by Representative AIKMAN of Poland. (GOVERNOR'S BILL) Cosponsored by Representatives: BENNETT of Norway, CARR of Sanford, LIBBY of Buxton, Senator: HARRIMAN of Cumberland. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, Maine has been undergoing difficult economic times and will continue to face difficult economic times; and

Whereas, Maine State Government must reflect the changes and restructuring that is occurring in the business community by centralizing fragmented services in a way that does not adversely affect the provision of services; and

Whereas, the State of Maine can no longer financially or philosophically invest in its current system, which perpetuates single-issue designs that lack comprehensive provider mechanisms; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Restructuring of Department of Labor. Resolved: That the 24 Department of Labor be restructured in accordance with the plan 26 required in section 2 and that a bureau whose function will include job service and job training be established within the 28 Department of Labor consisting of the following programs: Aid to Families with Dependent Children, general assistance and emergency assistance, food stamps, the Additional Support for 30 People in Retraining and Education program, and the Vocational 32 Rehabilitation Services Unit; and be it further

Sec. 2. Labor and Welfare Transition Team; creation. Resolved: 34 That the Labor and Welfare Transition Team is established to develop a plan of combining the programs of Aid to Families with 36 Dependent Children, general assistance and emergency assistance, 38 food stamps, the Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education program, and the Vocational Rehabilitation Services Unit with the jobs service and jobs training programs of the 40 Department of Labor into one administrative bureau. The team 42 shall develop recommendations for programmatic and structural changes concerning the restructuring of departments to provide a 44 flexible, efficient system of providing welfare and job training services that is responsive to clients, offers choices in 46 nonstandard services and gives users and providers results through performance and positive outcomes that are accessible and affordable; and be it further 48

Sec. 3. Development of plan. Resolved: That the team shall develop a plan for creating a system of providing welfare and job 2 training services that includes the following: 4 1. Ά streamlined management of organization and administration; б designed to address, 8 2. A structure that is when appropriate, the issues of families and children, and welfare and unemployment as single units; 10 duplication of 12 з. Guiding principle; goals. Resolved: That in developing the plan required in section 2, the team must be guided by the 30 principle that administrative structures can be reduced by integrating welfare and rehabilitation with education and 32 training for the future work force. In developing the plan, the team shall strive to effectuate the following goals: 34 Increasing efficiency and effectiveness; 36 1. 38 2. Focusing on jobs, rehabilitation and improvement of quality of life; 40 3. Expand opportunity for persons with disabilities; 42 Matching entitlement programs with job search and 4. 44 training functions; and a second s 5. Increasing speed of processing services without reducing 46 quality; and be it further 48 Sec. 5. Composition of the Labor and Welfare Transition Team; 50 chair. Resolved: That the team consists of the following members:

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1. Two Legislators serving on the Joint Standing Committee on Labor, one appointed by the chairs of that committee and one appointed by the first-named member of the minority party on that committee;

6 2. Two Legislators serving on the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources, one appointed by the chairs of that committee and one appointed by the first-named member of the minority party 8 on that committee;

з. Two representatives from the Department of Labor, 12 appointed by the Commissioner of Labor;

14 4. Two representatives from the Department of Human Services, appointed by the Commissioner of Human Services; 16

One member from a constituency or advocacy group 5. 18 concerned with welfare and job training issues, appointed by the Governor;

Sec. 6. Duties of the team. Resolved: That the duties of the team are as follows: 34

1. In addition to the principles outlined in section 3, the 36 team shall develop a common core of principles to apply in 38 creating this restructuring proposal;

The team shall consult the business community, private 40 2. industry councils, the advisory council appointed pursuant to the 42 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 1082, subsection 5, representatives of recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent 44 Children and consumer advocates;

46 3. The team shall hold regional meetings and hearings to gather technical information and consider public policy issues; 48 and

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4. The team shall present its plan and any necessary implementing legislation to the Governor prior to the Second Regular Session of the 116th Legislature for the Governor's approval in sufficient time for the Governor's presentation of the plan and legislation to the Legislature on or before January 15, 1994. The plan must address specific organizational structures, elimination of staff positions, reduction in funds and the legal and policy changes that are necessitated by the restructuring; and be it further

Sec. 7. Implementation of restructuring plan. Resolved: That the effective date for final implementation of the restructuring proposed in accordance with this resolve is July 1, 1994.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to develop a user friendly, 22 cost-effective network for programmatic and structural changes that would effectively enhance performance and positive outcomes 24 in the areas of Aid to Families with Dependent Children, general and energy assistance, food stamps, Additional Support for People 26 in Retraining and Education program, Vocational Rehabilitation Services Unit, job placement and employment and training. This bill requires that the Department of Labor be restructured to 28 accommodate these programs under its umbrella. This bill 30 establishes the Labor and Welfare Transition Team and directs the team to develop a plan to implement the restructuring.

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
