SENATE AMENDMENT "C" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 490, L.D. 1501, Bill, "An Act to Modify Various Licensing Board Laws"

Amend the amendment by inserting after the title the following:

'Amend the bill by inserting after the enacting clause and before section 1 the following:

'PART A'

Further amend the amendment in the first line after the title (page 1, line 16 in amendment) by striking out the following: "Amend" and inserting in its place the following: 'Further amend'

Further amend the amendment on page 2 by inserting after the 3rd indented paragraph the following:

'Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'PART B

Sec. B-1. 30-A MRSA §4211, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1989, c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is further amended to read:

2. State rules. No municipal ordinance may be less restrictive than the rules of the department relating to plumbing or subsurface waste water disposal systems as adopted under Title 22, section 42. ~~The department shall establish minimum permit~~

2 fees--by--rule. The rules of the department relating to all  
3 plumbing or subsurface waste water disposal systems have full  
4 force and effect, provided that, to the extent that a  
5 municipality has enacted more restrictive ordinances, the

8 Sec. B-2. 30-A MRSA §4211, sub-§5 is enacted to read:

10 5. Permit fees. The following permit fees may be charged.

12 A. A fixture fee of \$4 per fixture may be charged.

14 B. A maximum plumbing permit fee of \$4 may be charged for  
15 all other plumbing work.

16 C. A minimum plumbing permit fee may not be charged.

18 Further amend the bill by relettering the parts to read  
19 consecutively.

22 STATEMENT OF FACT

24 This amendment amends the laws governing plumbing  
25 regulations to provide that a plumbing permit fee of \$4 may be  
26 charged per fixture, a maximum plumbing permit fee of \$4 may be  
27 charged for all other plumbing work and a minimum plumbing permit  
28 fee may not be charged.
