An Act to Increase the Revenues of the Board of Examiners of Podiatrists.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Joint Standing Committee on Audit and Program Review has commenced a review of the Board of Examiners of Podiatrists; and

8 5787 A energia Whereas, the committee has determined upon preliminary review that the board is in danger of insolvency due to inadequate license fee revenues to support its activities; and

Whereas, the board owes several debts that potentially impede it's ability to properly act to regulate podiatrists in the interest of protection of the public health and welfare; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §3652, as repealed and replaced by PL 1981, c. 206, is amended to read: 2.6

28 §3652. Fees; reexamination; license renewal

30 Every applicant for an examination for a license to practice podiatry shall, at the time of filing his an application, pay to 32 the secretary of the Board of Registration-in-Medicine Examiners of Podiatrists a fee of \$100. In-case If the application is denied and examination refused, 1/2 of the fee shall must be 34 returned to the applicant. Any An applicant who fails to pass an examination shall-be is entitled to a reexamination within 6 36 months upon the payment of an additional \$50, but only 2 such 38 reexaminations shall-be are permitted. Podiatrists having-been licensed in another state and applying for a license to practice 40 in this State without examination shall pay a fee of \$100.

42 Every doctor of podiatric medicine licensed to practice podiatric medicine and surgery within this State shall, on or 44 before July August 1, 1981 1993 and on or before July 1st of every odd-numbered year thereafter, apply to the examiners for a certificate--of license renewal on a form furnished by the 46 examiners and shall pay a renewal fee of no-more-than-\$100 \$125.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved. 18

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill raises the fee for an annual license for doctor of podiatric medicine from \$50 to \$125 and changes the licensing cycle from a biennial cycle to an annual cycle. 26
