**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, State Government exists to provide services to
 6 citizens, and it is incumbent on state employees to provide the
 best service to "customers" of State Government in the most
 8 efficient and effective manner possible; and

10 Whereas, while providing quality service it is important that every state worker have a stake in the success and 12 improvement of State Government to make the most of accrued talent and experience; and

Whereas, both private and public sector organizations have found success in the total quality management approach to customer service and management, resulting in a more motivated and productive work force, as well as efficiencies and cost savings; and

Whereas, pursuant to Resolve 1991, chapter 73, total quality
 management procedures in State Government must be in place by the beginning of the 1994-95 biennium and need coordination,
 oversight and direction to accomplish the above goals; and

26 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 28 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 30 safety; now, therefore,

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §§49 and 50 are enacted to read:

### 36 §49. Maine Quality Management Council

38 The Maine Quality Management Council, as established by section 12004-I, subsection 77-A and referred to in this section 40 as the "council," is created to guide total quality management in the executive branch of State Government, to promote the delivery 42 of guality services to customers of State Government and to empower state workers in addressing the challenges and 44 responsibilities of State Government.

 46 1. Membership. The Governor is a member of the council and serves as the chair of the council. The Governor shall appoint
 48 the following members to the council:

A. Representatives of each executive branch department;

Page 1-LR2380(1) L.D.1542 <u>B.</u> Representatives of other departments and agencies of <u>State Government that choose to participate;</u>

<u>C. Representatives of each of the employee unions</u> representing state employees as designated by each union; and

8 D. Other members the Governor determines appropriate, including representatives of the Legislature and 10 representatives of up to 3 private sector businesses engaging in total quality management.

2. Terms of members. Members serve terms coincident with 14 the terms of the appointments to the positions qualifying them for the council, except that private sector members serve at the 16 pleasure of the Governor.

**3. Associate members.** Each member of the council shall name one associate member, except that council members
 representing state employee unions may appoint one associate member to represent each union bargaining unit. Associate
 members serve at the pleasure of the appointing council member.

**4. Meetings.** The council shall meet on a monthly basis at the call of the chair. A majority of members constitutes a quorum and decisions of the council must be achieved through consensus.

5. Duties. The council shall:

A. Develop a joint vision, values and tenets for State Government;

B. Provide policy guidance and direction to the Governor on the guality management process;

<u>C. Coordinate and oversee implementation of quality</u> management in State Government, including the work of individual quality councils in departments and agencies;

D. Determine guidelines for submission of guality management proposals by state departments and agencies to the council and criteria and procedures for approval of those proposals;

E. Coordinate and oversee process planning teams and process action teams, which may be formed to address specific problems and challenges in State Government;

F. Raise state employee awareness of total quality management in State Government;

<u>G. Assist the Governor in developing goals, objectives,</u> milestones and resource requirements to promote and improve quality and productivity in State Government;

H. Identify processes of State Government that are common to departments and need priority attention, and provide direction for achieving improvement in these processes; and

I. Undertake other responsibilities determined appropriate by the council to implement total quality management in State Government.

# 16 **§50.** Employment protection with implementation of total quality management

The Maine Quality Management Council shall develop procedures that ensure that any employee who has achieved 20 permanent status and whose position is eliminated as a direct result of improvements sanctioned by the council is provided an 22 employment opportunity elsewhere in State Government. The 24 procedures must be consistent with applicable civil service laws and collective bargaining agreements and must take into account such factors as qualifications, comparability of positions, 26 geographic locations of employees whose positions may be 28 eliminated, retraining requirements and other transition factors. The procedures, when submitted to the Bureau of Human Resources, must be adopted by the bureau as its own rule. 30 Nothing in this section prevents an employee from seeking and 32 accepting employment outside of State Government. If such employment is secured by an employee, the obligation created in this section is dissolved. 34

# Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §1589 is enacted to read:

38 <u>§1589. Appropriations and allocation balances</u>

 At the end of each fiscal year, unencumbered appropriation and allocation balances lapse into the appropriate fund or
 account balance and are not available unless authorized by law, or as provided for in subsections 1 to 5. Encumbered balances
 may not be carried forward more than once at the end of a fiscal year.

	1. Carry-forward and transfer authorized. At the end of
48	each fiscal year, 30% of the available balances remaining in each
	General Fund and Highway Fund account after the deduction of all
50	expenditures, encumbrances, commitments or outstanding payment

obligations that would otherwise lapse to each fund by law must be carried forward each fiscal year to be transferred and used as provided for in subsections 2 to 5.

2. General Fund statewide account: Highway Fund statewide account. The State Controller is authorized to transfer 5% of the available balances carried forward in accordance with subsection 1 in each General Fund account into a General Fund statewide account established by the State Controller and 5% of the available balances carried forward in accordance with subsection 1 in each Highway Fund account into a Highway Fund statewide account established by the State Controller.

143. Total quality management initiatives. Available<br/>balances carried forward in each department or agency General16Fund and Highway Fund account in accordance with subsection 1 and<br/>transferred into the General Fund statewide account and Highway18Fund statewide account in accordance with subsection 2 must be<br/>used for the payment of nonrecurring expenditures representing20total quality management initiatives in the same department or<br/>agency and statewide, respectively.

4. Copies of proposals to Bureau of the Budget and Office of Fiscal and Program Review. Copies of each proposal approved by the Maine Quality Management Council for the expenditure of funds carried forward in each General Fund and Highway Fund account in accordance with subsection 1 and transferred into the General Fund statewide account and the Highway Fund statewide account in accordance with subsection 2 must be submitted from each department or agency's quality management council and the Maine Quality Management Council, respectively, to the Bureau of the Budget and the Legislative Office of Fiscal and Program Review.

5. Payments in accordance with allotments. Payments from accordance and agency General Fund and Highway Fund account and the General Fund statewide account and the Highway Fund statewide account representing expenditures in support of approved proposals submitted to the Bureau of the Budget in accordance with subsection 4 must be authorized by the State Controller on the basis of allotments approved by the Governor in accordance with established law.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill encourages implementation of total quality 8 management, or TQM, in State Government. The 115th Legislature mandated a TQM approach for both management and labor in State 10 Government and this bill recognizes the need for closer collaboration between the executive branch and state employee 12 unions.

14 The bill creates and empowers the Maine Quality Management Council, made up of the Governor, representatives of executive
16 branch departments and agencies, state employee representatives and others. The council is established to guide TQM efforts in
18 State Government and develop shared vision, values and tenets for the TQM process in government.

This bill makes clear the intent of the Legislature that total quality management is designed primarily to make State Government more efficient and cost-effective and not to achieve direct reductions in the size in the work force. The bill directs the council to develop procedures to locate displaced employees elsewhere in State Government and to provide retraining options if necessary.
