HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 1150, L.D. 1550, Bill, "An Act to Reduce the Influence of Money in Elective Politics"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 9 the following:

'Sec. 10. 21-A MRSA §1063 is enacted to read:

§1063. Constitutional officers and State Auditor

The Secretary of State, the Treasurer of State, the Attorney General, the State Auditor or any candidate for those offices may not contribute to a candidate for the Senate or the House of Representatives, either directly or through a political action committee formed by that official for that purpose.

Further amend the bill by renumbering the sections to read consecutively.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment inserts a provision into the bill prohibiting contributions to candidates for state office by the constitutional officers, the State Auditor or candidates for those offices.
