## STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment permits a school board in a municipal school unit to waive the competitive bidding requirement for the purchase of school insurance if school insurance and municipal insurance are purchased as a package by the municipal government.

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The amendment also directs the Joint Standing Committee on Education to study the use of competitive bidding for the purchase of workers' compensation and employee benefit insurance and to prepare recommendations for the Second Regular Session of the 116th Legislature.
