SENATE AMENDMENT "C" to H.P. 1162, L.D. 1560, Bill, "An Act 14 Requiring Public Schools to Purchase Insurance through a Competitive Bidding Process"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 14 in paragraph A 18 in subparagraph (3) in the last line (page 2, line 8 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "or"

Further amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 14 in 22 paragraph A in subparagraph (4) in the last line (page 2, line 12 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "<u>5.</u>" and inserting in its 24 place the following: '<u>5; or</u>'

Further amend the bill in section l in subsection 14 in paragraph A by adding at the end a new subparagraph to read:

'(5) The school board is in a municipal school unit and school insurance and municipal insurance are purchased as a package through competitive bidding by the municipal government.'

Further amend the bill by adding at the end before the emergency clause the following:

'Sec. 2. Further study of competitive bidding. During the Second
Regular Session of the 116th Legislature, the Joint Standing
Committee on Education shall study the use of competitive bidding
for the purchase of workers' compensation insurance and employee
benefit insurance, including life, disability and health
insurance, and prepare recommendations for consideration by the
Second Regular Session of the 116th Legislature.'

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SENATE AMENDMENT

SENATE AMENDMENT " C" to H.P. 1162, L.D. 1560

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment permits a school board in a municipal school unit to waive the competitive bidding requirement for the purchase of school insurance if school insurance and municipal insurance are purchased as a package through competitive bidding by the municipal government.

The amendment also directs the Joint Standing Committee on Education to study the use of competitive bidding for the purchase of workers' compensation and employee benefit insurance and to prepare recommendations for the Second Regular Session of the 116th Legislature.

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
