

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. PL 1993, c. 277, §5 is enacted to read:

6 Sec. 5. Retroactivity. This Act applies retroactively to October 1, 1993.

8 Sec. 2. PL 1993, c. 341, §8 is enacted to read:

10 Sec. 8. Retroactivity. Section 1 of this Act applies retroactively to October 1, 1993.

12 Sec. 3. P&SL 1993, c. 11, §3 is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

16 Sec. 3. Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

18 Sec. 4. Retroactivity. Section 3 of this Act applies retroactively to April 15, 1993.

24 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

26 This bill makes the following technical corrections to certain recently enacted laws.

28  
30 1. Public Law 1993, chapter 277 eliminated the repeal of certain laws governing the power of sale foreclosure. Because  
32 that public law does not take effect until after October 1, 1993, this bill makes the repeal of the prohibition retroactive to  
34 October 1, 1993.

36 2. Public Law 1993, chapter 341 repealed the October 1, 1993 exceptions to the prohibition on the sale of products in  
38 containers connected by plastic holding devices. Because that public law does not take effect until after October 1, 1993, this  
40 bill makes the repeal of the prohibition retroactive to October 1, 1993.

42 3. Private and Special Law 1993, chapter 11 includes a referendum provision that reflects the content of the original  
44 bill, rather than the bill as it was amended by the committee amendment. Because the referendum provision is inconsistent with  
46 the enacted law, this bill removes the referendum language.
