

**An Act to Decrease the Number of Sleeping Rooms a Hotel Must Have
in Order to Obtain a Liquor License.**

3 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §1061, sub-§4, ¶A, as repealed and replaced**
5 **by PL 1991, c. 824, Pt. D, §4, is amended to read:**

6 A. The number of rooms required is based on the population
7 of the municipality in which the hotel is located, as
8 reported in the 1960 Federal Decennial Census. If the
9 population reported in the most recent Federal Decennial
10 Census is at least 20% less than the population reported in
11 the 1960 census, the most recent Federal Decennial Census
12 must be used to determine the number of rooms required.

13
14 (1) If the hotel is located in a municipality having a
15 population of 7,500 or less, the hotel must have at
16 least ~~12~~ 6 adequate sleeping rooms.

17
18 (2) If the hotel is located in a municipality having a
19 population of more than 7,500, the hotel must have at
20 least ~~30~~ 15 adequate sleeping rooms.

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23 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

25 This bill reduces by 1/2 the number of sleeping rooms a
26 motel must have in order to obtain a liquor license.
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33 This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the
34 need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical
amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.
