

An Act to Restrict the Type of Fishing Allowed on Long Pond, or Beaver Mountain Lake, to Artificial Lures and Flies.

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 26.
Received by the Clerk of the House on December 29, 1993. Referred to the Committee on Fisheries and Wildlife and 1200 ordered printed pursuant to Joint Rule 14.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7618-A is enacted to read:

6 **§7618-A. Fishing on Long Pond or Beaver Mountain Lake**

8 A person is guilty of illegal fishing on Long Pond, also
10 known as Beaver Mountain Lake, in Sandy River Plantation,
12 Franklin County if that person fishes or angles on Long Pond, or
14 Beaver Mountain Lake, by a means other than use of artificial
16 lures and flies.

14 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

16 This bill requires that people fishing on Long Pond, also
18 known as Beaver Mountain Lake, in Sandy River Plantation,
Franklin County fish only with artificial lures and flies.
