The amendment repeals the provision in current law that allows a person to purchase 26 licenses after September 30th for one-half the original fee. The amendment rounds down to \$46 the fee for lobster and crab fishing licenses issued to persons under 18 years of age and to persons 28 70 years of age or older. As proposed in the original bill, fees 30 for other classes of lobster and crab fishing licenses are rounded up to the nearest dollar. This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill. 3.2
