An Act to Establish a Financial Assistance Program for Utilities Burdened as a Result of State Highway Construction.

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Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §256, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 860, §1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

### §256. Financial assistance program for utilities

In order to assist water utilities and combination water and sewer utilities that have annual revenues of \$15,000,000 or less in the relief of extreme financial hardship caused by the relocation of utility facilities that are part of bridge and highway projects, the Department of Transportation shall loan to those utilities, interest free, 90% of the utility relocation cost, excluding the cost of upgrades, when the cost of the utility relocation is 5% or more of the utility's prior fiscal year revenues. The term of the loans may not exceed 20 years.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

Pursuant to Public Law 1991, chapter 860, the Department of Transportation was required to file a report with the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation for the development of a program to provide financial assistance to utilities experiencing serious financial hardship as a result of the relocation of facilities that are part of bridge and highway projects.

This bill implements the report presented to the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation in March 1993 establishing the financial assistance program for water utilities and combination water and sewer utilities that have an annual revenue of \$15,000,000 or less.

Under this program, the Department of Transportation will provide interest-free loans for up to 90% of the utility relocation cost when the cost of the utility relocation is 5% or more of the utility's prior fiscal year revenues.

This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.
