

2           **Sec. 1. Simplification of licenses and fees. Resolved:** That the  
Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall prepare a  
4           proposal to simplify the schedule of the licenses and fees  
administered by the department by combining licenses, eliminating  
6           stamps and using other means to reduce substantially the number  
of different licenses now sold; and be it further

8           **Sec. 2. Report. Resolved:** That the Department of Inland  
Fisheries and Wildlife shall submit draft legislation to the  
10           Legislature by January 1, 1995 that would implement the proposed  
simplified license and fee schedule developed under section 1.
