	1. Tagging required. The holder of a commercial
22	shellfishing license issued under section 6601 shall identify
	shellfish the license holder has taken by means of a harvester's
24	tag. The tag must be consistent with the format required by the
	department under rules adopted under this section. Each
26	container, hod or bag of shellstock must be tagged prior to
28	landing the shellstock. The tag must accompany the harvested product to the point of first sale either in the wholesale or
	retail trade.

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	This bill is required in order to meet the terms of the
2	National Shellfish Sanitation Program. That program establishes
4	the conditions under which the shellfish industry can engage in the interstate sale of shellfish. The National Shellfish
c at	Sanitation Program requirement is that harvesters must provide
ł 6	the information necessary to create a record of the origin,
·	quantity, quality and date of harvest, which can be used to trace
8	lots of questionable shellstock to the point of origin or

source. Reference to a section deleted in the statutes coincident to amended legislation in the last session is restored.

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This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.

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
