An Act Pertaining to Stage II Vapor Recovery.

(EMERGENCY)

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 26. Reference to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources suggested and ordered printed.

Presented by Senator CIANCHETTE of Somerset. Cosponsored by Senator: LUDWIG of Aroostook, Representatives: GOULD of Greenville, JACQUES of Waterville, LORD of Waterboro, REED of Dexter. Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Stage II vapor recovery is an extremely costly 6 measure for reducing volatile organic compounds to levels imposed by the federal Clean Air Act; and

Whereas, the cost of Stage II would be borne by state 10 businesses, many of which are small, independently owned gasoline service stations; and

Whereas, more economical alternatives exist, such as 14 transportation initiatives, through which the State can achieve the goals of the Clean Air Act; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §585-E is enacted to read:

§585-E. Stage II vapor recovery system not required

A gasoline service station in this State may not be required to implement a Stage II vapor recovery system for control of vehicle refuelling emissions at gasoline dispensing facilities, as that system is described in the Federal Register, Vol. 57, No. 74 in proposed rules, and pursuant to 42 United States Code, Section 7511a(b)(3).

36 Sec. 2. Effect of law. Any rule adopted by the Board of Environmental Protection before or after the effective date of 38 this Act that requires or implements Stage II vapor recovery at a gasoline service station in this State is void and has no effect. 40

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits the Board of Environmental Protection from adopting rules that would implement or require Stage II vapor recovery at gasoline service stations.

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This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.

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
