The deduction of unpaid assessments from income earned by prisoners who did not pay the assessment prior to incarceration may increase dedicated revenue to the Victims' Compensation Fund. The amounts generated can not be determined at this time.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

- 12 Currently, as part of the sentence, a court is required to impose assessments of \$10 to \$25. These assessments are to go to the Victims' Compensation Fund.
- The bill requires that this assessment be collected from the earned income of incarcerated persons if it has not previously been collected.
- This amendment requires that the court notify the agency with whom a person is to be incarcerated of any uncollected assessments due the Victims' Compensation Fund.
