An Act to Amend the Charter of the Brewer Water District.

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 26. Reference to the Committee on Utilities suggested and ordered printed.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. P&SL 1945, c. 146, §§6 and 7, are amended to read:

Sec. 6. Board of trustees. All the affairs of said district shall be managed by a board of 3 5 trustees, residents therein, who shall be appointed by the city council of the city of Brewer. They shall hold office for the term of 3 years and until their respective successors are appointed and qualified, except, however, as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 7. Trustees; how appointed; meetings; officers; vacancies filled 12 for the unexpired term. The first board of trustees shall be 14 appointed within 3 days after the meeting of the voters of said district to accept this act, 1 to serve until the 1st annual meeting of the district, 1 until the 2nd and 1 until the 3rd such 16 Thereafterward, 1 member shall be appointed by said meeting. 18 city council at its 1st regular meeting for the month of March to serve for the term of 3 years. As soon as convenient after the 20 trustees are first appointed the trustees shall hold a meeting at some convenient place in the district to be called by any member 22 thereof in writing designating the time and place and delivered in hand to the other 2 4 members not less than 2 full days before the meeting; provided, however, that they may meet by agreement 24 without such notice. They shall then organize by the election of a chairman and clerk from their own number, adopt a corporate 26 seal and by-laws, and perform any other acts within the powers delegated to them by law. When necessary they may choose a 28 treasurer and other needful officers and agents who shall serve 30 at their pleasure, and whose compensation shall be fixed by said trustees. The treasurer shall furnish bond in such sum and with 32 such sureties as they may approve. Members of the board shall be eligible to any office under the board, but shall not receive any compensation therefore except as trustees unless authorized by 34 vote of the city council of the city of Brewer.

The compensation of the trustees shall be \$50 each per annum unless otherwise provided by vote as above defined.

40 The trustees shall be sworn to the faithful performance of their duties as such, which shall include the duties of any
42 member as clerk or clerk pro tem. They shall make and publish an annual report including a report of the treasurer.

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Sec. 2. Election of new members; terms of new members. The 2 new members of the Board of Trustees of the Brewer Water District 46 must be appointed by the city council for the City of Brewer at its 3rd regularly scheduled meeting following the effective date 48 of this Act; one for a term expiring in 1995 and one for a term 50 expiring in 1996. After the initial appointment,

each new member holds office for a term of 3 years and until that member's respective successor is appointed and qualified in accordance with the procedures contained in Private and Special Law 1945, chapter 146, section 7.

Sec. 3. Acceptance subject to referendum. This Act must be 6 submitted to the legal voters within the district at an election called for that purpose and held by December 31, 1994. 8 The election must be called, advertised and conducted according to relating to municipal elections, except that the 10 the law registrar of voters is not required to prepare or the clerk to post a new list of voters and, for this purpose, the registrar of 12 voters must be in session the 3 secular days preceding the election, of which the first 2 days must be devoted to 14registration of the voters and the last day to verification of 16 the list and completion of the records of these sessions by the registrar. The subject matter of this Act is reduced to the 18 following question:

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"Do you favor amending the charter that created the Brewer Water District by adding 2 additional members to the Board of Trustees of the Brewer Water District?"

The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.

The results must be declared by the municipal officers of the City of Brewer and the due certificate of the results filed by the clerk with the Secretary of State.

This Act takes effect for all purposes immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters within the district voting at the special election. Failure of the approval by the necessary majority of voters at any such election does not prevent a subsequent election or elections from being held for that purpose.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill increases the number of trustees of the Brewer 42 Water District from 3 to 5. Expanding the Board of Trustees of the Brewer Water District is necessary to ensure that the 44 inhabitants of the district are adequately represented.

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This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.

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
