20 Act Concerning the Payment of Medical Expenses in Controverted Workers' Compensation Cases"
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Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting 24 clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. Report. The Superintendent of Insurance shall report 28 the joint standing committee of the Legislature having to jurisdiction over banking and insurance. matters on or before 30 January 15, 1995 regarding the payment of medical expenses in controverted workers' compensation cases. The report must include controverted workers' compensation cases in which the 32 injured person claims health care benefits under a health benefits plan offered through the same employer and under a 34 health benefits plan that is not offered through the same employer and must include options for legislation. The report 36 include information on liabilities between different must 38 insurance companies and options for legislation.'
