

Resolve, to Extend the Reporting Deadline of the Health and Social Services Transition Team.

(EMERGENCY)

Reported by Representative MITCHELL for the Health and Social Services Transition Team pursuant to Resolve 1993, chapter 36.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the
Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after
adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the reporting deadline of the Health and Social
Services Transition Team is January 1, 1994; and

Whereas, the transition team requires additional time to
complete its work and the deadline must be extended; and

Whereas, this extension must occur before the expiration of
the 90-day period; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
safety; now, therefore,

Sec. 1. Resolve 1993, c. 36, §2, amended. Resolved: That Resolve
1993, c. 36, §2 is amended to read:

Sec. 2. Health and Social Services Transition Team; creation.
Resolved: That the Health and Social Services Transition Team,
referred to in this resolve as "the team," is established. The
team shall develop all legislation needed to implement the
reorganization of services in accordance with this resolve,
including, but not limited to, amendments to the statutes,
reallocation of funds and transitional language. The legislation
must be presented to the Legislature by January February 1, 1994
for consideration during the Second Regular Session of the 116th
Legislature; and be it further

; and be it further

Sec. 2. Retroactivity. Resolved: That this resolve applies
retroactively to January 1, 1994.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
