

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 **Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §13080**, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 474, §1, is
4 amended to read:

6 **§13080. Loring Development Authority of Maine**
8 **established**

10 The Loring Development Authority of Maine is established to
12 carry out the purposes of this article. The authority is
14 entrusted with acquiring and managing the properties within the
16 geographical boundaries of Loring Air Force Base, the Madawaska
18 Dam and Treatment Facility, the Loring 03 Communications Site and
20 other property accepted by the Loring Development Authority of
22 Maine in accordance with this article.

24 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

26 This bill adds additional properties under the jurisdiction
28 of the Loring Development Authority of Maine. It includes the
30 Madawaska Dam and Treatment Facility, which is the primary water
32 source of the Loring Air Force Base. The bill also includes the
34 Loring 03 Communications Site, which contains the equipment
relating to the operation of the airport facility as well as
telecommunications capacity.

36 This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the
38 need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical
40 amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.
