

An Act to Amend the Labeling Requirement of Containers for the Purpose of Recycling.

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 26. Reference to the Committee on Business Legislation suggested and ordered printed.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §1865, sub-§3 is enacted to read:

6 3. Labels; oversized containers. A manufacturer who
8 manufactures beverage containers that would otherwise be
10 refundable pursuant to this chapter but are not because the
12 beverage container is over the maximum size requirement shall
14 permanently emboss or permanently stamp the beverage container
16 with the words "No Deposit - Recycle."

14 STATEMENT OF FACT

16 This bill requires a manufacturer who manufacturers beverage
18 containers that are over the maximum size requirement for
20 refundable beverage containers to indicate on the beverage
22 container that there is no deposit on the beverage container but
24 that the beverage container is recyclable.

26 This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the
28 need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical
amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.
