Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, Resolve 1993, chapter 25, established the Health Start Task Force, and directed that appointments be made by July 9, 1993; and

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Whereas, appointments to the task force were not completed until September 29, 1993 and the task force was not able to meet until October 8, 1993; and

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Whereas, the charge of the task force as presented in Resolve 1993, chapter 25, requires taking inventory of existing services, determining which services need to be developed or expanded and integrating all the existing, new and expanded services into a statewide program that can not be accomplished in a short period of time; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Resolve 1993, chapter 25, §1 is amended to read:

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Sec. 1. Task force created and charged. Resolved: That there is created the Healthy Start Task Force, referred to in this resolve as the "task force," which is directed to formulate a plan for implementation of a model Healthy Start home visitation program. The task force shall produce a detailed implementation plan for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources by Nevember-1,-1993 December 15, 1994. The task force plan and
