SENATE AMENDMENT "N" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1306, L.D. 1761, Bill, "An Act to Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government and to Change Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1994 and June 30, 1995"

Amend the amendment by inserting after Part CC the following:

PART DD

Sec. DD-1. Construction audit recoveries; General Purpose Aid for Local Schools; lapsed balances. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in fiscal year 1993-94, \$169,000 in the General Purpose Aid for Local Schools account lapses to the General Fund as a result of construction audit recoveries.

Sec. DD-2. Preschool handicapped children; General Purpose Aid for Local Schools. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Commissioner of Education is authorized to spend fiscal year 1993-94 audit recoveries in school construction aid or any unobligated balances in fiscal year 1993-94 General Purpose Aid for Local Schools, up to the amount of \$125,000, to meet the needs of preschool handicapped children in the Child Development Services program.

Sec. DD-3. Teacher aide position; health and safety issues; General Purpose Aid for Local Schools. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Commissioner of Education is authorized to spend fiscal year 1993-94 audit recoveries in school construction aid or any unobligated balances in fiscal year 1993-94 General Purpose Aid for Local Schools, up to the amount of \$11,000, to upgrade a teacher aide position pursuant to an arbitration decision and up to the amount of \$34,000 to fund health and safety needs at the Baxter School for the Deaf.

STATEMENT OF FACT

28 appropriation to General Purpose Aid for Local Schools. It also  
provides an additional appropriation for Preschool Handicapped  
30 Services. Funds are deappropriated or transferred from a variety  
of programs to partially offset these appropriations.
