An Act to Provide an Appropriation for a Federally Funded Hazard Mitigation Program within the Maine Emergency Management Agency.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, a nationwide awareness of the effect of large scale disasters has caused great concern among the nation's property 6 tax insurers and reinsurers for failure of their ability to pay damage claims; and 8

Whereas, the United States Congress is actively considering legislation that will, if passed, create a federal insurance trust fund and hazard mitigation program within the Federal Emergency Management Agency; and

Whereas, it is urgent that the legislatively approved mechanism be in place if such a federally funded program is available to the Maine Emergency Management Agency from the Federal Emergency Management Agency; and

Whereas, the federal and state fiscal years are not coincident and the United States Congress may enable the Federal 22 Emergency Management Agency to grant hazard mitigation program funds while the Legislature is not in session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 26 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 28 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the 34 Federal Expenditure Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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Provides for the allocation

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of additional federal funds for the Hazard Mitigation Program within the Maine Emergency Management Agency. This allocation includes funds for a Dam Safety Engineer position, 2 Word Processor Operator positions, one Communications Technician position, one Hazardous Materials Emergency Planner position, one Accountant I position and 8 Hazard Mitigation Planner positions.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

26 This bill anticipates that the United States Congress will pass legislation enabling a national hazard mitigation program administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. 28 The Federal Emergency Management Agency anticipates administering a 30 100% grant mitigation program through the states. In order to be ready for additional federal support and emphasis, the State needs to anticipate the change by appropriating the use of the 32 additional federal money and positions needed. The approved 34 positions and appropriated money created by this bill are contingent upon federal program and funding support.

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
