An Act to Strengthen the Coordinated Delivery of Substance Abuse Services in the State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. PL 1993, c. 410, Pt. LL, §14 is amended to read:

Sec. LL-14. Consolidation of substance abuse services programs. All substance abuse services and programs currently in existence throughout State Government, including but not limited to programs implemented by the Department of Education, the Department of Corrections and, the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, the Department of Public Safety and the <u>Maine National Guard</u>, are consolidated within the Office of Substance Abuse in accordance with the plan required in section 15.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
