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	2. Membership. The authority consists of 9 members as

Members of the authority are compensated 20 as provided in Title 5, chapter 379. 22 §12742. General powers and duties In addition to the duty set forth in section 12743, the 24 authority has the following powers and duties: 26 1. Bylaws. To adopt bylaws for the regulation of its 28 affairs and the conduct of its business; 30 2. Educational services. To contract with educational institutions to provide York County secondary school graduates 32 and nontraditional students continuing education in technical disciplines and apprenticeship training. The authority shall consider contracting with the University of Maine System, the 34 Maine Technical College System, public secondary schools and other educational institutions; 36 38 3. Funds. In addition to receiving state funds, to solicit and accept money or other things of value from businesses, 40 foundations, the Federal Government and other appropriate entities to fund and carry out the authority's activities; 42 4. Equipment. To purchase equipment needed to conduct the 44 authority's activities; and 46 5. Other powers. To perform other functions necessary to the powers and duties set forth in this chapter. 48

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill establishes the York County Continuing Education б Authority. The authority is charged with creating and reporting to the First Regular Session of the 117th Legislature a plan to implement a program of education in technical disciplines and 8 apprenticeship training in York County for secondary school graduates and nontraditional students. The plan must address 10 curriculum, capital and operating budgets and administration of 12 the program by the University of Maine System, the Maine Technical College System, public secondary schools or any combination of these entities. The authority is empowered to 14 solicit and receive funds from businesses, foundations, the Federal Government and other appropriate entities and to contract 16 with educational institutions to provide services.

This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.

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
