Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6071, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 381, \S^2 , is amended to read:

6 4. Salmon imports prohibited. It is unlawful to import for introduction into any waters of the State any Atlantic salmon, live or as eggs, that originate in any Icelandic or European 8 territorial waters or any other species of salmon, exclusive of 10 rainbow trout, originating west of the North America continental divide. After-January-1--1995--it-is-unlawful-to-introduce-inte any-waters-of-the-State-any-Atlantic-salmon that originate-in-any 12 Icelandie-or-European-territorial-waters-or-any-other-species-of 14 salmon,--exclusive-of--rainbow--trout,---originating-west-of--the North--American--continental--divide--including--any--fish--raised 16 within-the-State from eggs or broodstock that are subject to the import-prohibition-under-this-subsection. The commissioner may 18 grant an exemption from the provisions of this subsection for a term not to exceed 2 years, renewable upon application, for 20 legitimate research. Legitimate research does not include pilot, demonstration or full-scale aquaculture production of salmon in 22 the coastal waters of the State.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill removes the prohibitions on the origin of salmon 28 to be introduced into the waters of the State.
