Sec. 1. Working group convened; minimum standards. Resolved: That the Interagency Task Force on Homelessness and Housing 2 Opportunities is directed to convene a working group to develop recommended standards for the operation of adult and family 4 shelters in the State. The membership of the work group must be appointed by the Chair of the Interagency Task Force on 6 Housing Opportunities Homelessness and and must include consumers, representatives of the Maine Coalition for the 8 Homeless, the Maine Coalition of Family Crisis Services and other affected constituencies, including providers of shelter to 10 families, persons with mental illness and persons with substance abuse problems; and be it further 12

14 Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the Interagency Task Force on Opportunities Homelessness and Housing shall submit its alonq with implementing 16 recommendations, any necessary legislation, to the 117th Legislature on or before January 15, 1995. 18

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve ensures that a consistent quality of care is provided to homeless adults and families with children in state shelter facilities. At present, only shelters for homeless children and youth, as a category, are required to comply with minimum operational standards. The resolve will define those standards and introduce a licensing process for adult and family shelters.

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
