HOUSE AMENDMENT "Ito COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P.
16 1385, L.D. 1884, Bill, "An Act to Ensure Proper Funding of the Department of Environmental Protection"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 5 and 20 inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 5. 38 MRSA §352, sub-§5-B, as amended by PL 1993, c.
 356, §4; c. 370, §2; c. 378, §3; c. 410, Pt. G, §1; c. 632, §2
 and affected by c. 410, Pt. G, §2, is repealed.'

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of section 10 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 10. Transfers to the Maine Environmental Protection Fund.
Prior to September 1, 1994, the State Controller shall transfer \$184,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to
the Maine Environmental Protection Fund from the excess of total General Fund revenues received over accepted estimates at the close of fiscal year 1993-94. That transfer must take place only after the required transfer of funds to the Maine Rainy Day Fund
pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1513 and only if sufficient unappropriated surplus remains to transfer a total of \$184,000 to the Maine Environmental Protection Fund.

40 Sec. 11. Effective date. If there is insufficient unappropriated surplus in the General Fund to provide for the transfer of funds
42 pursuant to section 10, section 4 takes effect September 1, 1994 and is retroactive to July 1, 1994. If there is sufficient
44 unappropriated surplus in the General Fund to provide for the transfer of funds pursuant to section 10, section 4 does not take
46 effect.'

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1385,

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of the fiscal note and inserting in its place the following:

This bill includes various allocations and deallocations from the Maine Environmental Protection Fund program, the Bureau of Air Quality Control and the Bureau of Hazardous Materials and Solid Waste Control for fiscal year 1994-95 to transfer funding responsibilities and realign program activities. The overall result is a \$189,078 net deallocation of federal funds and a \$60,439 net deallocation of dedicated revenue. A total of 6 positions that are eliminated in this bill are reestablished as General Fund positions at a total cost of \$300,000 for fiscal year 1994-95 in the committee amendment to the supplemental 22 budget bill (LD 1761).

If \$184,000 is available from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund for fiscal year 1993-94, those funds will be transferred to the Maine Environmental Protection Fund and the scheduled fee increases will not take place. If the transfer of funds does not take place by September 1, 1994, then the increase of various fees collected by the Department of Environmental Protection for the fund will result in an estimated annual increase of \$184,000 in dedicated revenue beginning in fiscal year 1994-95.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment directs the State Controller to transfer \$184,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Maine Environmental Protection Fund, if sufficient funds remain after the required transfer of funds to the Maine Rainy Day Fund.

If sufficient funds remain and that transfer is accomplished prior to September 1, 1994, the fee increases proposed in the committee amendment do not take effect.

If that transfer does not take place prior to September 1, 1994, the fee increases proposed in the committee amendment take 50 effect on September 1, 1994.
