HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1386, L.D. 1885, Bill, "An Act  
to Implement the Recommendations of the Maine Sardine Council"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 12 the following:

'Sec. 13. Transfer of property. All equipment and vehicles  
owned by the Maine Sardine Council on the effective date of this  
Act remain equipment and vehicles owned by the council as an  
instrumentality. The State must transfer title from the State to  
the Maine Sardine Council for the land and buildings that were  
transferred pursuant to Resolve 1963, chapter 125, from James E.  
Flanagan to the State and recorded in the Penobscot County  
Registry of Deeds, Book 1944, page 271. Transfer of title under  
this section must be executed for consideration of one dollar and  
must take place within 180 days after the passage of this Act.  
The Maine Sardine Council must pay all consideration and  
administrative costs associated with the title transfer.'

Further amend the bill by renumbering the sections to read

**STATEMENT OF FACT**

This amendment clarifies the original property transfer  
provisions that were originally in the bill. The amendment

2 states that equipment and vehicles owned by the Maine Sardine  
Council as a state agency remain equipment and vehicles owned by  
4 the council in its new capacity as an instrumentality.

6 The amendment also directs the State to transfer title for  
land and buildings acquired by the State in 1964 using the Maine  
8 Sardine Council's money. All costs associated with transferring  
title for that property must be paid by the council.
