HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1392, L.D. 1890, Bill, "An Act to Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue in the Amount of \$14,000,000 to Construct Environmental Protection Facilities and to Investigate, Abate, Clean up and Mitigate Threats to the Public Health and Environment from Uncontrolled Hazardous Substances Sites"

Amend the amendment by striking out the substitute title and replacing it with the following:

'An Act to Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue in the Amount of \$15,300,000 to Construct Water Pollution Control Facilities and to Investigate, Abate, Clean up and Mitigate Threats to the Public Health and Environment from Uncontrolled Hazardous Substances Sites'

Further amend the amendment in section 1 in the 10th line (page 2, line 1, in amendment) by inserting after the word: "Program" the following: ', \$1,300,000 for water pollution control facilities grants'

Further amend the amendment in section 1 in the 10th line (page 2, line 1 in amendment) by striking out the following: "\$4,000,000" and inserting in its place the following: '\$9,000,000'

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of section 6 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 6. Allocations from General Fund bond issue. The proceeds of the sale of bonds must be expended as designated in the following schedule.'

30 "'Do you favor a \$15,300,000 bond issue for the following
purposes: (1) \$4,000,000 for construction of local water
32 pollution control facilities, providing the state match for
\$20,000,000 in federal funds; (2) \$1,000,000 for the Small
34 Community Program; (3) \$1,300,000 for water pollution
control facilities grants; and (4) \$9,000,000 to provide for
36 the investigation, abatement, cleanup and mitigation of
threats to the public health and environment from
38 uncontrolled hazardous substances sites or other hazardous



48 The estimated cost of sending this bond issue out to
referendum will vary according to the total number of referenda
50 enacted during the Second Regular Session of the 116th
Legislature. The estimated cost to the Secretary of State if one
to 6 referenda are enacted is \$95,000. Each additional
52 referendum costs an additional \$7,000.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1392,
L.D. 1890

If approved by the voters, the total cost of this bond issue
is estimated to be \$16,830,000 with principal payments of
\$15,300,000 and interest payments of approximately \$1,530,000.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment sets the total amount of the bond issue at
\$15,300,000. It adds \$1,300,000 for the improvement and
construction of water pollution control facilities for the Town
of Rangeley and the Soldier Pond community and increases from
\$4,000,000 to \$9,000,000 the amount allocated to address Maine's
active and potential uncontrolled hazardous substance sites.
