8	Section 1. Election. The <u>Until the 1998 general election</u> , the Secretary of State shall be chosen biennially at the first
10	session of the Legislature, by joint ballot of the Senators and Representatives in convention.

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	Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective
12	date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall
	notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and
14	plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a general election, at the next general election in the month of
16	November following passage of this resolution, to vote upon the
18	ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to provide that the Secretary of State be elected by the people every 4 years in the same manner as the Governor is elected?"

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The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further

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Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This resolution provides for direct popular election and for filling a vacancy in the office of the Secretary of State in the manner currently provided for the office of Governor.
