An Act to Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue in the Amount of \$20,000,000 for the Remediation and Closure of Municipal Solid Waste Landfills.

Presented by Senator HARRIMAN of Cumberland. (GOVERNOR'S BILL).

Preamble. Two thirds of both Houses of the Legislature deeming it necessary in accordance with the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 14, to authorize the issuance of bonds on behalf of the State of Maine to provide funds for the closure and remediation of municipal solid waste landfills.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Authorization of bonds to provide for funds to investigate, abate, clean-up and mitigate threats to public health and the environment from municipal solid waste landfills. The Treasurer of State is authorized, under the direction of the Governor, to issue bonds in the name and behalf of the State in an amount not exceeding \$20,000,000 to raise funds to properly close and remediate threats to drinking water supplies and other environmental resources as a direct result of the leaching of pollutants from municipal solid waste landfills as authorized by section 6. The bonds are a pledge of the full faith and credit of the State. The bonds may not run for a period longer than 10 years from the date of the original issue of the bonds. At the discretion of the Treasurer of State, with the approval of the Governor, any issuance of bonds may contain a call feature.

Sec. 2. Records of bonds issued to be kept by the Treasurer of State. The Treasurer of State shall keep an account of each bond showing the number of the bond, the name of the successful bidder to whom sold, the amount received for the bond, the date of sale and the date when payable.

Sec. 3. Sale; how megotiated; proceeds appropriated. The Treasurer of State may negotiate the sale of the bonds by direction of the Governor, but no bond may be loaned, pledged or hypothecated on behalf of the State. The proceeds of the sale of the bonds, which must be held by the Treasurer of State and paid by the Treasurer of State upon warrants drawn by the State Controller, are appropriated solely for the purposes set forth in this Act. Any unencumbered balances remaining at the completion of the project in section 6 lapse to the debt service account established for the retirement of these bonds.

Sec. 4. Interest and debt retirement. The Treasurer of State shall pay interest due or accruing on any bonds issued under this Act and all sums coming due for payment of bonds at maturity.

Sec. 5. Disbursement of bond proceeds. The proceeds of the bonds must be expended as set out in section 6 under the direction and supervision of the Department of Environmental Protection to evaluate, close and remediate municipal solid waste landfills.

24	Sec. 7. Contingent upon ratification of bond issue. Sections 1 to 6 do not become effective unless the people of the State have
26	ratified the issuance of bonds as set forth in this Act.
28	Sec. 8. Appropriation balances at year end. At the end of each fiscal year, all unencumbered appropriation balances representing
30	state money carry forward. Bond proceeds that have not been expended within 10 years after the date of the sale of the bonds
32	lapse to General Fund debt service.
34	Sec. 9. Bonds authorized but not issued. Any bonds authorized but not issued, or for which bond anticipation notes are not
36	issued within 5 years of ratification of this Act, are deauthorized and may not be issued; except that the Legislature
38	may, within 2 years after the expiration of that 5-year period, extend the period for issuing any remaining unissued bonds or

14	Sec. 10. Referendum for ratification; submission at general election; form of question; effective date. This Act must be submitted to the
16	legal voters of the State of Maine at the next general election
ΙU	in the month of November following passage of this Act. The municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of

their respective cities, towns and plantations

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meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a general election, to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the following question:

"Do you favor a \$20,000,000 bond issue to protect the State's drinking water resources by granting funds to cities and towns for the proper closure of their solid waste landfills?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the Act, the Governor shall proclaim the result without delay, and the Act becomes effective 30 days after the date of the proclamation.

The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this Act necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The funds provided by this bond issue, in the amount of \$20,000,000, will be used to address environmental problems at municipal solid waste landfills. The funds will be used for the evaluation and closure of municipal and utility district solid waste landfills. Approximately 385 remaining municipal landfills in the State will be evaluated and closed over the next 2 to 3 years with proceeds from this bond issue. The money remaining from previously approved bonds issued for this purpose is inadequate to meet the State's cost share commitment to evaluate, close and remediate all the remaining municipal solid waste landfills.

This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.
