

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §1202, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:

6 2-A. Licensure of reciprocity. The board shall issue a  
8 license to any person who files a sworn application, who is  
10 licensed under the laws of another state or territory of the  
12 United States and who has been licensed and actively engaged in  
14 electrician's work for a minimum of 5 years, as long as that  
16 state or territory has licensing standards and experience  
18 requirements equivalent to this State.

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**STATEMENT OF FACT**

This bill allows the Electricians' Examining Board to license electricians in this State when licensed in other states and territories of the United States, provided that their experience and length of licensure meet the minimum requirement of 5 years.

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This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.
